If you missed last year's South Marshall Street Block Party where 500 residents mingled with volunteers from Trinity and other neighborhood churches, here's another opportunity for us to "live deep" and "live wide" in our neighborhood.

Enjoy an early evening celebration with hot dogs and hamburgers, games for children, and a variety of fun entertainment. **Over 25 non-profits from our neighborhood will be providing activities for children. Trinity Church is sponsoring popcorn and a jump castle. (There might just be a free-will offering T-shirt waiting for you, designed by Trinity's artist-in-residence, Georges Annan-Kingsley)**

The Block Party, just three blocks from Trinity, begins at Marshall House and stretches past the **beautiful row of Habitat-built houses**, to the end of the block where the Karen and Nepali communities live. This event is a wonderful opportunity for the residents to get to know each other, and, it is a **terrific opportunity for us, as part-time neighbors, to get to meet some of our permanent neighbors!**

South Marshall Street has long been regarded as a struggling neighborhood. Through a collaboration of churches (**including Trinity Church**), businesses, and the Marshall Street community, miracles are happening there.

**Park at Trinity Church and walk through our neighborhood to experience the *Miracle on South Marshall Street*.** It is a quarter-mile to the site.
