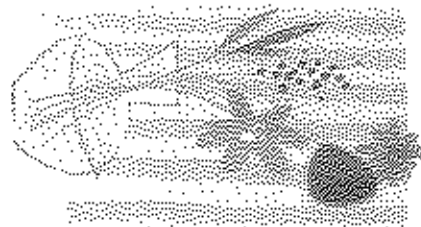

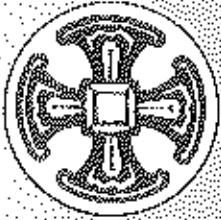

Annual Membership Renewal Form

2010 Dues

Note: You will be counted as a 2010 member in good standing when CEEP's office receives this form.

Annual Membership Dues are established by the Board of Directors based on Article 11, Section 7, of the By-Laws of the Consortium of Endowed Episcopal Parishes. Dues are payable for each calendar year, January 1- December 31. For Calendar year 2010, this pledge form, stating your parish's payment plan for 2010, must be in the Consortium's office prior to the 2010 Annual Conference. The 2010 Annual Conference is February 24-27 in Austin, TX.

The dues structure is based upon the market value of all endowment assets. For this purpose, "endowment assets" is the sum of the market value of all securities and other principal funds in restricted, unrestricted, third party held, or vestry designated accounts, plus the estimated value of the net income-producing real estate and for profit businesses. The endowment value for 2010 is based on a three year trailing average of the endowment (as of 12/31/08).



SENTENCE OF DEPOSITION UPON THE RENUNCIATION OF THE MINISTRY

In accordance with Title IV, Canon 8.1, of the Constitution and Canons of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, John R. Corbiere, on December 15, 2009, declared to me in writing the renunciation of his priestly Ministry in this Church and his request to be removed therefrom. With the advice and consent of a majority of all members of the Standing Committee of the Diocese of Connecticut, I accept the renunciation made to me. In accordance with Title IV, Canon 12.4.c, I do hereby impose the Sentence of Deposition upon

thus releasing him from the obligations of the ministerial office of Presbyter and depriving him of the right to exercise gifts and spiritual authority as a Minister of this Church conferred on him at his ordination.
