The Choir School of Hartford, is interviewing students for the coming school year. If you know a child who likes to sing and who is in grade 3-12 (unchanged voice), please contact the parish office at 860-527-8133 to set up an interview. Students in the Choir School are eligible to receive a free weekly 1/2 hour piano lesson and a keyboard provided for their use if one is not available at home. They also receive training in singing, music reading and theory, and work through the Royal School of Church Music *Voice for Life* curriculum. Rehearsals are each week on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Students sing for the 10:00 a.m. Sunday services and monthly Evensongs. The participants receive a stipend and have an opportunity to earn medals and awards.

Looking for something worthwhile to read over the summer? Consider *Suite Francaise*. Trinity's Book Group meets on **Friday, August 6th**, to discuss this book, a recently discovered novel about the Nazi occupation of France, written by Irene Nemirovsky in 1941-42. Nemirovsky was born to a wealthy and cultured Russian Jewish family that emigrated to France during the Russian Revolution, when she was a girl. She became a successful author in the pre-war years, but in 1942 she was deported to Auschwitz and died there. *Suite Francaise* has received numerous accolades; *The New York Times Book Review* called it "Stunning...A tour de force."
