#### **Good Morning**

Whether this is your first time at Trinity, your first time in a long time, or if you're here every Sunday, we are delighted that you are worshipping with us this morning.

#### **WELCOME**

If you are new to Trinity, we hope you will introduce yourself and sign one of the guest books at either entrance to the Church. Restrooms are located in two places. Exit through the rear doors of the Sanctuary and go to your right. The white doors on your left are the restrooms. Restrooms can also be found if you exit the door at the front right of the Sanctuary and go down the hall toward the exit to the parking lot. The restrooms are on your right once you pass the fireplace.

#### **NAMETAGS**

To make it easier for us to get to know each other, we ask everyone to wear a nametag. If you do not have a reusable nametag, stickers and markers are at each entrance. If you would like to have a reusable nametag made for you, please print your name on the clipboard next to the trays of reusable nametags.

#### KIDS IN CHURCH

If you need to step out of the service with your infant or toddler and are in search of a quiet space to spend a few moments, the parent room (at the end of the North Narthex past the door to the Memorial Garden) is open during the 10 AM service. There is no childcare attendant, so all children must be accompanied by their parent/guardian.

**INTERCESSORY PRAYER** Private intercessory prayer is available with members of our Intercessory Prayer team in the side aisle while Communion is being distributed at the 10:00 AM service. Additionally, there are Prayer Jars at each entrance to the Sanctuary where you can share prayers requests that will be prayed over for the next month.

#### **HEARING ASSISTANCE**

Our church offers assistive listening devices for individuals with hearing difficulties. These devices allow them to receive amplified sound directly through their compatible hearing aids. If you need assistance using an assistive listening device, please see a church usher.

#### **ABOUT OUR WORSHIP**

Most of the worship service is printed in this leaflet. Music that is not printed in the leaflet can be found in *The Hymnal 1982* (the red book on the shelf under the chair in front of you) or Lift Every Voice and Sing II (the red, black, and green book found on a cart at each entrance). THE FIRST READING ACTS 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ--he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Then the disciples returned to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.



For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. 

### Welcome Music Guest Katie Kennedy

KATIE KENNEDY, director and cello faculty, based in Hartford, Connecticut enjoys an active and varied performing and teaching career. As an orchestral player, she performs with the Hartford Symphony, New Hampshire Music Festival, Portland Symphony, New Haven Symphony and numerous choral groups including Concora, Voce and Yale Camerata. She has collaborated with composers, dancers, and film-makers. She enjoys theater work and has played shows at the Long Wharf Theater, the Bushnell and Hartford Stage, including the original production of the musical Anastasia. Kennedy has given numerous chamber music and new music recitals including performances at Brown University, Dartmouth College, Hartt College of Music, Hartford Art School, Harvard University, Trinity College (CT), SUNY Stonybrook, University of Maine. Her performances have been broadcast on National Public Radio, Performance Today and Maine Public Radio. She has also enjoyed accompanying and collaborating with pop acts on occasion including Stevie Wonder and Idina Menzel.

Kennedy teaches cello and chamber music as a faculty member at the University of Hartford's Hartt School and formerly taught at the Loomis Chaffee School and the Community Music School in Springfield. Her students have earned top prizes and first chairs in state-wide competitions, festivals and youth orchestras. Kennedy began cello studies with her dad, Jim Kennedy, went on to receive a B.M. in cello performance from Oberlin College Conservatory where she studied with Peter Rejto, and continued her studies at the Franz Liszt Academy in Budapest, Hungary with Csaba Onczay.

#### THANK YOU

Even in this time of transition, Trinity Church continues to look and feel like it always has. Our worship is reliably beautiful, we enjoy consistently lovely music, the sermons are thoughtful and provoke us to grow in our faith, we continue to greet one another with great joy during the passing of the peace, and our adult forums are informative. Also very importantly (since we are, after all, Episcopalians) there is usually coffee hour following the service.
