





A Message from Rev. D: When are we re-opening?

As more and more people are getting vaccinated, one of the questions swirling in a lot of people's minds and hearts is, "When are things going to be back to normal?" For us at Trinity, that question often takes the form of "When are we going to start back having in person worship inside the church?" At this time I do not have a particular target date by which we will be opening. As long as the data from https://portal.ct.gov/coronavirus/covid-19-data-tracker continues to put Hartford and the surrounding communities in the red zone, we will not have in person indoor worship. However, the vestry, lay leaders of ministries, and I are having conversations about ways that we can slowly begin increasing opportunities for increased in-person participation before we reach the point of being ready to fully open. In some ways, this period of time feels more difficult than earlier in the pandemic when almost everything was shut down. I pray that we can continue to faithfully gather for worship and connect with each other in the ways that we have available to us now while we eagerly anticipate what will come. 
Women Together
