




The Stewardship Committee hopes that you will complete both of the tasks in the pledge packet this year. We need your financial pledge for planning and budgeting, as always. But


Email Fraud Alert

Save the Date! Adult Christian Formation – Sunday, December 6 "The Mandala" Presented by Ellison (Elli) Findly

Spiritual practices that originated in other religious traditions can have value for Christians. One practice that might be a good fit for Advent during a pandemic is the making and contemplation of a design called a mandala. Elli Findly is a retired professor of religion from Trinity College, where she was a colleague of Frank Kirkpatrick. Here is her summary of the session:

The mandala, or "circle," is a visual field of power that can heal and transform. Known in many traditions, we will explore the types of mandala in Buddhism, and the way their images are built on symbolic structures of circles and squares, and their meanings based on "palaces" of mind, body, and cosmos. The mandala is a powerful means of spiritual change, and its practice is a unique form of meditation that transmutes the five emotions and brings about calm and wisdom. A slide talk with discussion.

Changes to the Holy Land Giving Tree

The holidays are fast approaching, and although things will be different this year, we still need to celebrate and to think of those in need. Our Holy Land Giving Tree is usually full of picture ornaments of children from the Ahli Hospital in Gaza and we have offered olive wood ornaments as well. To donate on-line go to www.afedj.org. Click on "Give" at the top. Then choose "Give on-line", choose your amount, choose Ahli Hospital as your hospital recipient, and click the box for Christmas gift.

AFEDJ is the organization that oversees our gifts and makes sure they go directly to our hospital or school of choice. Donations made online can be made in honor of someone and AFEDJ will send a card either directly to your recipient or they will send the card to you so you may give it in person. Gifts to the hospital through Trinity will all be sent in together at the end of December.

In some families, this gift card might provide the money for the only present a child receives, so please contribute if you can to make a child's holiday brighter.

Welcome to Trinity's New Refugee Family!!

Trinity Church has received a request from Integrated Refugee and Immigrant Services (IRIS, "our" refugee agency in New Haven), to actively assist a Congolese refugee family who was settled in Hartford about four years ago by another agency that now is inactive. Anne Rapkin and Drew Smith have met with the family and are eager for the Trinity Community to be an active part of supporting this family.

The family is comprised of three generations. The head of the family is a mother (and grandmother) whose husband died in the Tanzanian refugee camp there they had lived for twenty years after fleeing the Congo; the father died one week before the family came to the United States. In addition to her, there are her six children ranging in age from middle school through adulthood as well as the wife and child of the oldest of her children. The mother and three of the adult members of the family are employed, and another child has begun studies at a community college, intent on becoming a nurse. They are members of the Bahai faith, and are actively supported by the Bahai community based in East Hartford.

The immediate needs of the family include English language instruction, especially for the older adults, medical and dental care for all members of the family, and help for pursuing educational vocational goals, including mentoring. As was the case with our prior refugee families, IRIS (Integrated Refugee and Immigration Services) will be supporting us. Even as we look for additional partnerships for this new co-sponsorship with IRIS, we have begun to search for and link the family members with appropriate resources.

Are you interested in helping out in some way? Much of what needs to be done does not involve inperson contact, so can be done consistently with Covid 19 safety protocols.
