




THE SECOND READING Romans 13:11-14

^{*}This version of the Nicene Creed is from one of the sources that has been approved for use by the General Convention of the Episcopal Church. The most significant difference is that this version changes 'who proceeds from the Father and the Son' to 'who proceeds from the Father.' This change restores the Creed to the version that was originally accepted by both Western and Eastern Orthodox Churches. (The phrase 'of the Son' was added a few hundred years later by a regional synod and was never adopted by Eastern Orthodox Churches).







that will follow on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.


Start-up Dressmaking Shop! Items needed!

Saheba Dadwall, the mom of Trinity's Afghan refugee family, is an expert dressmaker and will soon open out of the family's home a dressmaking shop! This is a wonderful opportunity for Saheba to supplement the family's income and to take pride in her excellent skills. At this time, the refugee resettlement committee is looking for the following items, either new or used, so long as, if used, they are in good condition:

- 1. A steam iron. The iron should be heavier than you'd use for ordinary ironing chores.
- 2. An ironing board, pressing cloth, and tailor's ham.
- 3. Dressmaking shears, pinking shears, ordinary scissors for cutting paper, small sharp scissors (for cutting thread), and a rotary cutter
- 4. Bobbins
- 5. Thread for a sewing machine: 100% polyester thread, Coats & Clark (also just labeled as Coats) and Gütermann, are preferred, but cotton/poly thread is acceptable. (The concern is that all-cotton thread may shrink when the garment is washed).
- 6. Tape measure / Tailor's chalk
- 8. Seam-ripper
- 9. Hand-sewing needles and pins and a pin cushion
- 10. Dressmaker's forms, one for a woman and one for a girl

December 4th ACF Forum: Episcopal Polity and Why it Matters at Trinity

Do you know how decisions get made in The Episcopal Church?


