





THE GOSPEL John 1:29-42

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. *People Glory to you, Lord Christ.*

John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

^{*}This version of the Nicene Creed is from one of the sources that has been approved for use by the General Convention of the Episcopal Church. The most significant difference is that this version changes 'who proceeds from the Father and the Son' to 'who proceeds from the Father.' This change restores the Creed to the version that was originally accepted by both Western and Eastern Orthodox Churches. (The phrase 'of the Son' was added a few hundred years later by a regional synod and was never adopted by Eastern Orthodox Churches).


Presider

Note: Considered by many to be the greatest jazz pianist of all time, 7-time GRAMMY winner Oscar Peterson was born in Montreal to immigrant parents from the West Indies. After a bout with tuberculosis as a child affected his lung capacity, Peterson left his trumpet studies and devoted himself fully to the piano instead. He eventually met Norman Granz, who became his life-long manager and close confidant, not only promoting his music in a professional capacity, but also bravely standing up for Peterson and other black jazz musicians who faced innumerable challenges during the 1950's and 1960's. The tune today's anthem is based on - Hymn to Freedom - was written in 1962 by Oscar Peterson as an ode to the Civil Rights Movement. We offer this as a humble tribute to Oscar Peterson's musicianship and the fight for racial justice on this Sunday before Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day.






