
Forum on the 2021 Trinity Church Budget following the 10 AM service on Sunday, March 21

Follow-up information from the 2/21 Open Forum on Racial Disparities in Health:




Trinity Church Book Group

The Companions of the Holy Cross invite the women of the parish to a book discussion of: <u>How to be an Antiracist</u> by Ibram X. Kendi.


