



THE FIRST READING Amos 7:7-17

This is what the Lord God showed me: the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb line, with a plumb line in his hand. And the LORD said to me, "Amos, what do you see?" And I said, "A plumb line." Then the Lord said,

"See, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass them by;

the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword."

Then Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, sent to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, "Amos has conspired against you in the very center of the house of Israel; the land is not able to bear all his words. For thus Amos has said,

'Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land.'"

And Amaziah said to Amos, "O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, earn your bread there, and prophesy there; but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom."

Then Amos answered Amaziah, "I am no prophet, nor a prophet's son; but I am a herdsman, and a dresser of sycamore trees, and the LORD took me from following the flock, and the LORD said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'

"Now therefore hear the word of the LORD.

You say, 'Do not prophesy against Israel, and do not preach against the house of Isaac.'

Therefore thus says the LORD:

Your wife shall become a prostitute in the city, and your sons and your daughters shall fall by the sword, and your land shall be parceled out by line; you yourself shall die in an unclean land,

and Israel shall surely go into exile away from its land."

To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae:


Grace to you and peace from God our Father.

And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

^{*}This version of the Nicene Creed is from one of the sources that has been approved for use by the General Convention of the Episcopal Church. The most significant difference is that this version changes 'who proceeds from the Father and the Son' to 'who proceeds from the Father.' This change restores the Creed to the version that was originally accepted by both Western and Eastern Orthodox Churches. (The phrase 'of the Son' was added a few hundred years later by a regional synod and was never adopted by Eastern Orthodox Churches).







Gun Violence Awareness Stole

Today Rev. D is wearing a Gun Violence Awareness Stole made by Colleen Hintz. Colleen created the first of these stoles when several Bishops, including Bishop Ian Douglas, convened Bishops United Against Gun Violence in the aftermath of Sandy Hook. She has continued to make them in hopes that "these stoles will help raise awareness and action until the day comes when they become a footnote in history."

Rev. D. wears the stole today for Jayland Walker (killed by Akron police on June 27th), for Jayla Heaven (killed in Hartford on July 4th), those killed in Highland Park (on July 4th), and those who were killed by gun violence this past week whose names we do not know. In the face of unrelenting gun violence in our streets and in our country, symbolic actions like this can seem as empty as offering "thoughts and prayers." However, Rev. D. hopes that the stole keeps our hearts open to compassion for those impacted by gun violence and full of fire to do whatever we can to end gun violence in our communities.






Giving statements for the period ending June 30, 2022 were mailed the end of last week. Please allow several days for the post office to make deliveries. You can check your balance on the statement.
