Holy Week 2018

This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations. . . Genesis 9:12

During this season of Lent we have reflected on the ways in which God has demonstrated God's faithfulness to all of God's creatures, despite our human failures in that covenant relationship. God's faithfulness is unconditional, demonstrated most perfectly in the total self-giving of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

As we enter Holy Week, we recall the joy and expectation with which the crowds welcomed Jesus in the streets of Jerusalem. But alas, the political and religious powers of the day turned the crowds against him, leading to a mock trial, his torture and cruel execution on a cross. But we know that was not the end of the story.

As we walk with Jesus this week, we are reminded that the social and political conditions are in many ways unchanged: they continue to turn us away from the message of Jesus. Just as His Body was broken by the crowds and the Roman soldiers, we repeat that act symbolically each time we turn away from Him. May this Holy Week be a time for you to walk with Jesus through His passion, to more fully rejoice in the Risen Christ on Easter Day.

We are glad you are with us! If you are new to Trinity, we hope you will introduce yourself to the clergy and a greeter and sign one of the guest books at either entrance to the church. Following the service, you are invited to enjoy refreshments and fellowship in Goodwin Hall.

Please pick up your name tag from the trays in Goodwin Hall or at the Sigourney Street entrance. If you do not have a name tag, simply fill out a blank and leave it in the basket after the service; a printed name tag will be made for you. It is part of our ministry of hospitality to let people know who we are.

COMMUNION

If you prefer to receive consecrated grape juice rather than consecrated wine at the 10:00 a.m. service, after receiving the bread, proceed to the Minister holding a ceramic chalice in the north aisle in front of the chapel. Gluten free wafers are available from the priest serving communion on the lectern (right) side of the altar rail. If you are not prepared to receive Communion today, you are invited to receive a blessing fro the priest, indicating your desire to do so by crossing your hands over your chest.

CHILDREN AT WORSHIP

Children infant-3 years are offered care in the Nursery during the 10:00 a.m. service. Children between the age of 3 years and second grade are welcome to worship in the church and are encouraged to participate in Godly Play when it is in session during the Liturgy of the Word. If children become restless, need to talk or need a break, there is a table along with coloring materials and children's books in the Parents' Room next to the bathrooms in the Narthex (hallway at the Sigourney Street entrance to the church.) Parents are reminded that children should not be allowed to leave the worship area on their own but should be accompanied by a parent.



If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. 





THE PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

The customary responses before and after the Gospel are omitted. The congregation remains seated until the arrival at Golgotha, when all stand or kneel.

Narrator When morning came, all the chief priests and the elders of the people conferred together

against Jesus in order to bring about his death. They bound him, led him away, and

handed him over to Pilate the governor.

When Judas, his betrayer, saw that Jesus was condemned, he repented and brought back

the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders. He said,

Judas "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood."

Narrator But they said,

Chief Priests "What is that to us? See to it yourself."

Narrator Throwing down the pieces of silver in the temple, he departed; and he went and hanged

himself. But the chief priests, taking the pieces of silver, said,

Chief Priests "It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, since they are blood money."

Narrator After conferring together, they used them to buy the potter's field as a place to bury

foreigners. For this reason that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. Then was fulfilled what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah, "And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of the one on whom a price had been set, on whom some of the people of Israel had set a price, and they gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord commanded me." Now Jesus stood before the governor; and the

governor asked him,

Pilate "Are you the King of the Jews?"

Narrator Jesus said, Jesus "You say so."

Narrator But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he did not answer. Then Pilate

said to him,

"Do you not hear how many accusations they make against you?"

Narrator But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the governor was greatly

amazed. Now at the festival the governor was accustomed to release a prisoner for the crowd, anyone whom they wanted. At that time they had a notorious prisoner, called

Jesus Barabbas. So after they had gathered, Pilate said to them,

"Whom do you want me to release for you, Jesus Barabbas or Jesus who is called the

Messiah?"

Narrator For he realized that it was out of jealousy that they had handed him over. While he was

sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent word to him,

Pilate's Wife "Have nothing to do with that innocent man, for today I have suffered a great deal

because of a dream about him."

Narrator Now the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas and to

have Jesus killed. The governor again said to them,

Pilate "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?"

Narrator And they said, People "Barabbas."

Narrator Pilate said to them,

"Then what should I do with Jesus who is called the Messiah?"

Narrator All of them said,

People "Let him be crucified!"

Narrator Then he asked,

Pilate "Why, what evil has he done?"*Narrator* But they shouted all the more,

People "Let him be crucified!"

Narrator So when Pilate saw that he could do nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he

took some water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying,

Pilate "I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves."

Narrator Then the people as a whole answered,

People "His blood be on us and on our children!"

Narrator So he released Barabbas for them; and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be

crucified. Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the governor's headquarters, and they gathered the whole cohort around him. They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on his head. They put a

reed in his right hand and knelt before him and mocked him, saying,

Soldiers "Hail, King of the Jews!"

Narrator They spat on him, and took the reed and struck him on the head. After mocking him,

they stripped him of the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away

to crucify him.

Members of the Congregation rise, as able, and remain standing for the remainder of the reading.

Narrator As they went out, they came upon a man from Cyrene named Simon; they compelled this

man to carry his cross. And when they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull), they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And when they had crucified him, they divided his clothes among themselves by casting lots; then they sat down there and kept watch over him. Over his head they put the charge against him, which read, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews." Then two bandits were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left. Those

who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying,

People "You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! If you are

the Son of God, come down from the cross."

Narrator In the same way the chief priests also, along with the scribes and elders, were mocking

him, saying,

Chief Priests "He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of Israel; let him come down

from the cross now, and we will believe in him. He trusts in God; let God deliver him

now, if he wants to; for he said, 'I am God's Son.'"

Narrator The bandits who were crucified with him also taunted him in the same way. From noon

on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three

o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice,

Jesus "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?"

Narrator that is,

Jesus "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Narrator When some of the bystanders heard it, they said,

People "This man is calling for Elijah."

Narrator At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and

gave it to him to drink. But the others said,

People "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him."

Narrator Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. (Pause.)

At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook, and the rocks were split. The tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised. After his resurrection they came out of the tombs and entered the holy city and appeared to many. Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and said,

Centurion

"Truly this man was God's Son!

Narrator

Many women were also there, looking on from a distance; they had followed Jesus from Galilee and had provided for him. Among them were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of the sons of Zebedee.

When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who was also a disciple of Jesus. He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus; then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. So Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock. He then rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb and went away. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there, sitting opposite the tomb.

The next day, that is, after the day of Preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate and said.

Chief Priests "Sir, we remember what that impostor said while he was still alive, 'After three days I will rise again.' Therefore command the tomb to be made secure until the third day; otherwise his disciples may go and steal him away, and tell the people, 'He has been raised from the dead,' and the last deception would be worse than the first."

Narrator

Pilate said to them.

Pilate

"You have a guard of soldiers; go, make it as secure as you can."

Narrator

So they went with the guard and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone.
